Stop homophobia in sport

Marking Justin Fashanu Day on May 2nd "Tackling homophobia in sport by singing"

Sing along with Jonathan Hellyer. Various Voices will mark Justin Fashanu Day, to highlight the issue of homophobia in sport. This free open special event will see international choirs, sports people and the public singing the football anthem 'You'll Never Walk Alone' on the banks of the Thames in a flash-mob style performance.

The event will kick off with a forum debate on tackling homophobia in sport, including speeches from The Football Association, gay sports groups and leaders of The Justin Campaign, the group fighting for the eradication of homophobia in sport. The focus will be on strategies around solutions.

The event, which starts at 1.30pm in the Clore Ballroom in The Royal Festival Hall, will see 'competitive singing' between teams, to echo the

singing of opposing fans on the terraces. Speakers include:

Dave Raval, Football referee and Ambassador for The Football Association.

Jason Hall, organiser of The Justin Campaign, whose aim is to get the football authorities to observe Saturday 2nd May 2009 as Justin Fashanu Day. Their long-term aim is to get 2nd May as the annual international day of protest against homophobia in sport.

A representative of EACH (Educational Action Challenging Homophobia).

The crowd are expected to be singing 'You'll Never Walk Alone' outside on the Southbank waterfront at 2.15pm.

The Justin Campaign and Justin all-stars Team

Justin Fashanu Day on 2nd May this year marks the 11th anniversary of the death of Justin Fashanu, still the only openly gay professional footballer. Fashanu killed himself after enduring years of taunts and bullying from the terraces, from team mates and from the football establishment, despite huge acclaim

for his football skills. The Justin Fashanu All-stars created by the Justin Campaign, supported by the FA, promotes the inclusion of openly gay players in football. Jason Hall, from the Justin Campaign, said: "We decided that the best thing to do was to have a campaigning football team so the football does the talking.

What the Police and the Football Association are doing

The Metropolitan Police Services LGBT Liaison Team and Hate Crime Coordinators work with the LGBT population and key service providers, voluntary and community organisations and the local community in order

to make London a safer place for LGBT people, improve service provision to victims/witnesses of hate crime and generally, improve the wellbeing of the LGBT population. The FA, says: "We are trying to do more to

reduce homophobic chants and things. On a local level, unfortunately, we still do get cases of homophobic abuse to players and players are reported, booked and sent off for it and they are duly fined and suspended"
